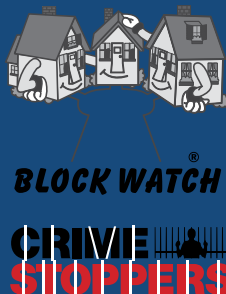
COMMUNITY SAFETY & CRIME PREVENTION

# The Nomination

## SELECTION CRITERIA

Nominations will be reviewed and selected based on the following:

### COMMITMENT

The individual, group or program has actively participated in preventing crime and enhancing community safety.

### PERSEVERANCE

The individual, group or program has helped encourage others to action or has influenced local or provincial policy and programs.

### INNOVATION

The individual or group has developed an innovative crime prevention idea, project or strategy.

### CONTRIBUTION

The individual, group or program has contributed towards the reduction of crime and the enhancement of community safety.

## NOMINATION PROCEDURE

To nominate an individual, group or program, complete the Award Nomination and Justification for Nomination forms and submit to the Safe Communities Working Group. The forms can be found on the following two pages and online at:

## NOMINATIONS

Nominations will be reviewed on the basis of the contributions made to a specific community, no matter how large, small, urban or remote.

To nominate an individual, group or program, please complete the Award Nomination with a description of how this nominee's contribution to crime prevention is worthy of recognition (Justification For Nomination). Nominations submitted by a police member in support of another police member must also demonstrate that they are endorsed by a member of the community.

Awards will be presented during B.C. Crime Prevention Awareness Week – Nov 1 - 7, 2012.

# The Awards

## ANTHONY J. HULME AWARD OF DISTINCTION

This premier award honours the extraordinary lifetime contribution and commitment by a practitioner, volunteer or group to crime prevention and community safety.

## KENNETH M. LEMCKERT COMMUNITY POLICING AWARD

This award recognizes an individual or community group that has provided exemplary leadership in the area of community policing.

## WAEI T. AUDI YOUTH POLICING AWARD

This award officially recognizes police officers who have demonstrated outstanding commitment to working with youth in their communities.

## CRIME PREVENTION & COMMUNITY SAFETY AWARD

This award recognizes exemplary leadership through developing innovative projects and key activities or initiatives to promote safe communities.

There are two categories:

**COMMUNITY GROUP/ORGANIZATION:** The nominee must be an organization, community group or individual that has provided exemplary leadership in the area of community safety, restorative justice or crime prevention. Contributions may include the development of innovative projects, key activities or initiatives, promotional activities, or the effective use of technology to promote safe communities.

**INDIVIDUAL:** The nominee may be in a paid or volunteer capacity working independently or on behalf of a government, police department, or community agency.

## CHILDREN OR YOUTH LEADERSHIP AWARD

This award honours positive role models for children or youth in their community and encourages their active participation in crime prevention and community safety projects. The nominee can be in either a paid or non-paid position. Children or youth nominated for this category should have demonstrated outstanding leadership skills and be actively involved in crime prevention and community safety projects in their communities or at school.

## LOCAL GOVERNMENT AWARD

This award recognizes outstanding leadership in the area of promoting and implementing crime prevention and community safety strategies in the community. The nominee should be a local government (i.e., municipality, village, regional district) that has demonstrated outstanding leadership in this area.

## CORPORATE AWARD

This award recognizes a business that has made an outstanding contribution towards crime prevention and community safety strategies in B.C., either locally, regionally, or province-wide. The nominee should be a business or corporation (large or small) that has worked in partnership with others (i.e., local/provincial governments, community-based groups) by providing resources, assistance, financial support and program contributions towards this aim.

## MEDIA AWARD

This award honours an individual in media relations or a media group that has been actively involved in promoting crime prevention and community safety programs either by audio, visual, and/or written methods (e.g., public service announcements, special programming).

## VOLUNTEER AWARD

This award honours an individual's commitment, in a non-paid position as a volunteer, to their community through outstanding contribution towards crime prevention, restorative justice or community safety.
